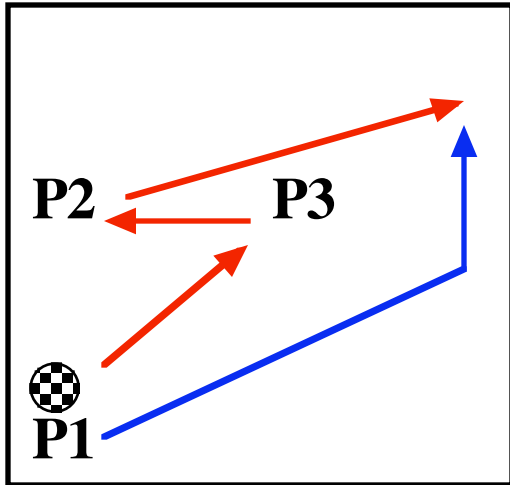


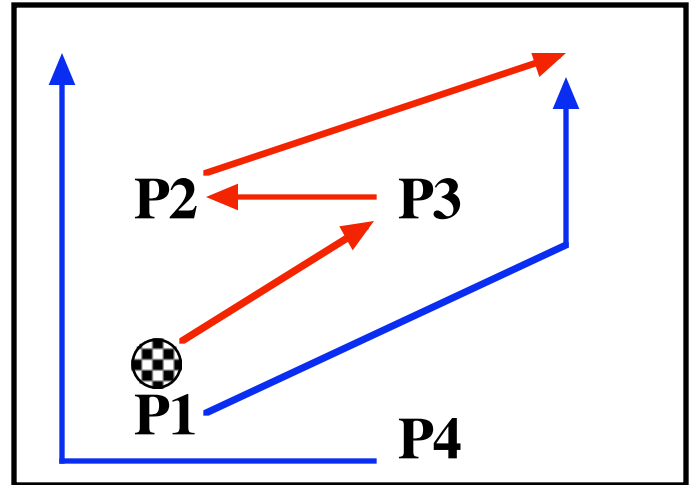
TECHNICAL: Overlapping Runs

SINGLE OVERLAP

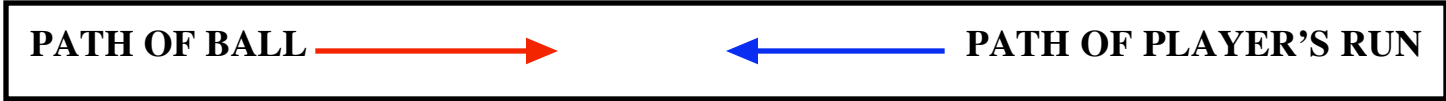


- > Player 1 passes to Player 3 and then “overlaps” (or runs behind) Player 3
- > Player 3 passes square to Player 2 who should be facing Player 3 when receiving the ball
- > Player 2 passes to Player 1

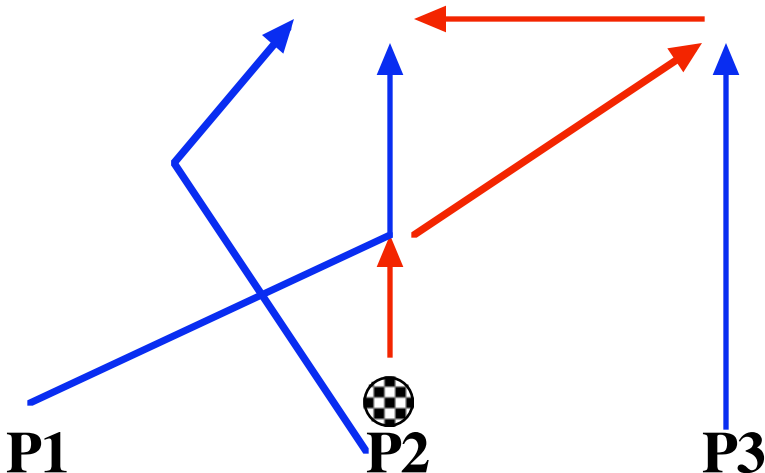
DOUBLE OVERLAP



- > Player 1 passes to Player 3 and then “overlaps” (or runs behind) Player 3
- > Player 4 “overlaps) Player 1
- > Player 3 passes square to Player 2 who should be facing Player 3 when receiving the ball
- > Player 2 passes to Player 1



OVERLAP TO GOAL



- > Player 1 makes diagonal run in front of Player 2
- > Player 2 passes to Player 1 and then “overlaps” behind Player 1’s run
- > Player 3 makes run down flank
- > Player 1 passes ahead to Player 3 and then makes straight run to goal
- > Player 2 covers back post
- > Player 1 covers middle to near post
- > Player 3 crosses ball into box
